

DEREK HART AT TAYNTON SHOW

Just in time for the opening

Had one paid a call on a villager at Taynton or Tibberton on Saturday afternoon, the chances are that the journey would have been futile. For almost every villager - the total population of the two villages only about 600—was to be found at the Taynton and Tibberton Village Hall where the first show and fete for seven years was held.

It was by popular demand that the occasion — which used to be an annual affair in the district — was re-introduced.

At a public meeting it was' decided to ahead and the gamble came off for the event was a great success.

Secretary Mrs. A. H. Davis told "The Citizen" that over £14 in gate money had been collected.

Derek Hart, well known for appearances In the BBC TV programme "Tonight" and "Mrs. Dale's Diary," opened the fete—with a few minutes to spare.

A friend of Mr. M. Philips Price, the MP for West Gloucestershire, Derek was given the wrong train time and had to rush to the fete from London in his car. He arrived just in time to declare the fete open. He stayed over the weekend at Tibberton Court—the home of Mr. Philips Price.

There were many attractions to interest the public who did not enter the actual show. They could skittle for a pig, try their hand at clock golf, attempt to drive tractor backwards, take part in sports, or enter a tennis tourney.

The show attracted no less than 600 entries, an all-time record.
